

I. General Provisions

The Universiade of the Organization of Turkic States (hereinafter referred to as the Universiade) is designed to strengthen the friendship of peoples through sports games and competitions in various disciplines and sports.

- The Universiade is held with the following objectives:
- Strengthening and maintaining fraternal relations between countries;
- attracting the younger generation and youth to systematic physical education and sports;
- developing competition based on sports principles;
- forming a healthy lifestyle and increasing social activity among young people;
- establishing effective interaction between countries in the field of sports;
- developing Olympic and non-Olympic sports
- and forming continuity in high-performance sports;

1.1. The main objectives of the Universiade are:

- improving the performance of athletes and national teams of the participating countries;
- high-quality organization and holding of sports competitions on an annual basis;
- developing knowledge, skills and exchanging experience among workers in the field of physical education and sports;
- improving sports skills and gaining experience in international competitions;
- establishing and strengthening ties between sports organizations of the participating countries.

2. Venue, dates and participants of the Universiade

2.2. The Universiade of the Turkic States will be held with the participation of national teams of the Turkic States in Cholpon-Ata, Issyk-Kul region, Kyrgyz Republic, from September 3 to 9, 2025.

Students officially registered as students at a higher education institution from the member countries of the Organization of the Turkic States are allowed to participate in the III Turkic Universiade.

The age of the participants in the competition must be no younger than 17 and no older than 25 years at the time of the competition.

- decorates the venues where the Universiade events will be held with banners and other printed materials;
- provides volunteers with the required knowledge of English and Turkish;
- rents sports facilities and grounds, and provides sports equipment for competitions;
- carries out work to find and attract sponsors;
- provides refereeing for the competitions;
- provides assistance in organizing accommodation and meals for the national teams of the OTS member states during the Universiade;
- ensures the acceptance and registration of applications from the OTS member states through the accreditation system on the official website of the federation.

5. Responsibilities of the OTS member states

5.1. Authorized bodies in the field of physical culture and sports of the participating countries:

- distribute the regulations and other information on the event and ensure the participation of athletes;
- assemble and approve the national team of the OTS member states to participate in the Universiade;
- provide uniform sports equipment (uniform);
- provide participants in team sports with two sets of game uniforms of different colors;
- ensure travel (airfare) of the national team on the dates of the established arrival and departure according to the competition schedule;
- ensure the submission of applications for participation from the OTS member states and the accreditation of athletes;
- bear the costs of paying national judges in accordance with the approved tariffs of the current legislation of their participating countries;
- fulfill the requirements and observance of the rights of athletes and participants in the Universiade.

6. Conditions for holding competitions

6.1. The number of athletes and types of sports participating in the Universiade are determined by agreement between the participating countries.

6.2. Competitions are held in the following sports.

6.3. Competitions in sports are held in accordance with current international standards and rules, as well as the conditions for holding competitions in sports (Appendix No. 1).

6.4. The chief judges and chief secretaries, the credentials committee, and the organizing committee are approved by the country hosting the Universiade.

6.11. The winners of the Universiade are determined by the sum of points for all competitions.

6.12. All participants must be in a uniform with country attributes and a flag.

7. Conditions for summing up the Games

7.1. Competitions are held in the sports set out in Chapter 6 of these Regulations.

7.2. For first place in each sport, 10 points are awarded, for second place - 5 points, for third place - 3 points, teams that do not take prize places do not earn points.

7.3. In the event of an equal number of points, the advantage is given to the team that has successively more 1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc. places in individual events of the program.

8. Awarding

8.1. Teams that take 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in the competitions are awarded cash prizes, medals, diplomas and a cup of the corresponding degrees.

8.2. The prize fund of the competitions is 85,000 (Eighty-five thousand) US dollars and is provided for in the budget of the authorized body for the corresponding year of the competition.

8.3. For the places taken in the medal count, teams are awarded:

- 1st place - 45,000 US dollars;
- 2nd place - 25,000 US dollars;
- 3rd place - 15,000 US dollars.

Cash prizes are transferred to the account of the winning country and can be distributed among the athletes and their coaches who took prize places independently by the participating countries.

9. Financial conditions.

9.1. Athlete accreditation is 80 US dollars per athlete per day, which includes meals and accommodation for the duration of the competition. Universiade participants must stay only in hotels accredited by the organizer.

9.2. The accreditation fee is transferred to a special account determined by the Universiade organizers.

9.3. The Directorate for Olympic Games Sports and Holding Sports and Mass Events "Zhashtyk" bears the following expenses:

- awarding of the Winners and prize winners with medals, diplomas, cups;
- transportation costs of the participants on the territory of the Universiade venue;
- production of printed materials;
- payment for meals for judges in sports;

RULES AND TYPES OF SPORT PROGRAMS

Chess

Team composition – 4 people + 1 coach + 1 team representative

The tournament is held according to the rules of FIDE (International Chess Federation) with a time control of 25 minutes for the entire game of "Rapid Chess" in a round robin system.

In case of a tie, places are determined by additional indicators:

- personal meeting;
- victory on 1, 2, 3 boards.

If any player is absent from the round for 30 minutes, he is counted as a loser.

If the flag of one of the opponents falls, he is counted as a loser. If both flags fall, a draw is recorded.

Basic rules of the game: take - move, castling begins with the king.

Table tennis

Team composition - 4 people + 1 coach + 1 team representative

Individual and team competitions are held separately among men and women. A match between teams consists of two meetings: men's (singles - doubles) and women's (singles - doubles).

Each meeting consists of 5 games up to 3 wins. 2 points are awarded for a win, 1 point for a loss, 0 points for no-show.

In case of a tie in points between two teams, the advantage goes to the team that wins the meeting between them.

In case of a tie in points between three or more teams, the advantage is determined sequentially:

- by the best difference in won and lost games in the meetings between them.

The main panel of judges has the right to make adjustments to the conditions of the competition within the current rules.

Volleyball

Team composition – 28 people (12 girls + 12 boys) + 2 coach

Competitions are held in a round robin system.

Places will be distributed based on the number of points scored based on the results of the matches played

Points will be awarded to each team as follows:

Victory with a score of 3:0, 3:1 3 points

Victory with a score of 3:2 2 points

Loss with a score of 0:3, 1:3 0 points
Defeat with a score of 2:3 1 point
